TEACHING ASSISTANT

We are now offering a 16 month programme which includes day release in one of our training centres and structured on-the-job training provided by the employer (School).

WHO THE QUALIFICATION IS FOR?

This qualification would be appropriate to anyone aged 18 or above who have already achieved a Level 2 qualification in a similar field within the children's workforce.

You will be required to work independently, with guidance and support from your employer.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should possess an interest in working with children and young people and have excellent communication skills. Acceptance onto the programme will be subject to qualifications and experience and successfully completing an initial assessment and interview.

Applicants will also be required to undergo a Criminal Records Bureau check.

WORK PLACEMENT / EMPLOYMENT

You may already be employed or we can help you secure a suitable position with a local school who will support you throughout your apprenticeship and pay you a wage. This will be negotiated with your employer but will be a minimum of £2.50 per hour

ASSESSMENT

Assessment will be carried out in different ways gathering knowledge from direct observation of practice, witness evidence from the employer, professional discussion, written assignments and tasks set by CACHE for knowledge learning outcomes.

PROGRESSION

Candidates who complete this qualification could progress onto a training programme for higher level teaching assistant status or a foundation degree. There are also opportunities to develop a career in teaching.

Optional units are selected to fit around your responsibilities at work.

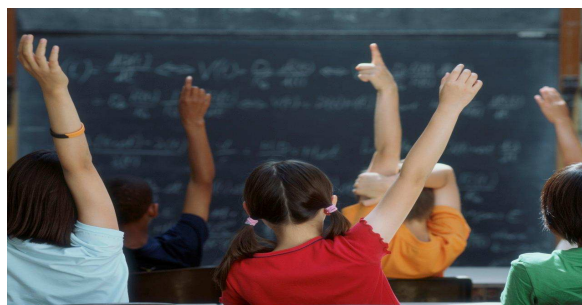
